

Does the Australian government support the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

A spokesperson for the Department of Infrastructure said the Australian government provides the Shire of Cocos (Keeling) Islands with a significant level of funding to meet its local government obligations, including waste management.

How much is the government committed to the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The spokesperson said the government is committed to the sustainable provision of essential services and infrastructure to the people of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, with a total of \$170 million committed towards this in 2023-24.

Are the Cocos (Keeling) Islands littered with rubbish?

A study published by the University of WA last year found the Cocos (Keeling) Islands were among the most heavily affected by beached waste in the Indian Ocean. Studies have estimated the Cocos (Keeling) Islands are littered with hundreds of tonnes of rubbish. (Supplied: Silke Stuckenbrock)

How do the Cocos (Keeling) Islands communicate?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands have access to a range of modern communication services. Digital television stations are broadcast from Western Australia via satellite. A local radio station, 6CKI - Voice of the Cocos (Keeling) Islands, is staffed by community volunteers and provides some local content.

How much does a bin collection cost on the Cocos Islands?

The annual cost of a bin collection on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands is now \$580 for residents and almost \$5,000 for public agencies. So far, government agencies have refused to pay.

Where can I watch the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

It is available in paper and electronic formats. The Cocos (Keeling) Islands receives a range of digital channels from Western Australia via satellite and is broadcast from the Airport Building on the West Island on the following VHF frequencies: ABC6, SBS7, WAW8, WOW10 and WDW11
