

How much energy does Cuba use per month?

By the end of 2020, the average consumption of private clients in Cuba was 185 kilowatts/hour (kWh) per month: just over 2200 kWh per year. Practically the amount of energy that reaches any geographic location in Cuba in the form of solar irradiance in a year (around 1825 kWh per cubic meter).

Does Cuba need a redesigned energy sector?

Concerns over Cuba's dependence on Venezuela are translating into the need for a fundamentally redesigned energy sector and more flexibility for investors. The pandemic has accentuated Cuba's need to diversify and move from oil-generated energy to renewable sources of energy (RES).

What will Cuba do about the energy crisis?

The Cuban government plans to invest significantly in photovoltaic parks and wind farms to address the severe energy crisis on the island for several months. The authorities in Havana also intend to support citizens in installing solar panels.

Does Cuba have a domestic RES industry?

Cuba is developing a domestic RES industry, including solar panels, wind turbines, hydro turbines, poles, and boilers for use in small bioelectric plants. This strategy is expected to enable Cuba to integrate domestic products into RES projects, thus reducing import costs and energizing the economy.

Cuba is reportedly boosting the use of photovoltaic solar energy, and is carrying out two projects since early 2024 to add 1,000 megawatts in two years to the national power grid, looking at adding the same amount of generation by 2031. In Cuba, solar panels cost about 4 per watt on average. The average Cuba homeowner needs a 6.3-kilowatt system, which would cost about \$16,643 with the federal tax credit, or \$23,799 before the 0 tax credit is applied.

How much do solar panels cost for a 2,000 square foot house? A solar system for a 2,000 square foot house costs, on average, \$29,200 before incentives and around \$20,500 after the 30% tax credit. That's a rate of \$10.32 per square foot of living space.

As of December 2024, the average solar panel system costs \$3.04/W including installation in Illinois. For a 5 kW installation, this comes out to about \$15,194 before incentives, though prices range from \$12,915 to \$17,473. After the federal tax credit, the average price drops by 30%.
