

Does the United Arab Emirates have solar power?

While being a major oil producing country, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) has taken steps to introduce solar power on a large scale. However, solar power still accounts for a small share of energy production in the country.

What is Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum solar park?

Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park is part of Dubai's energy diversification initiatives to meet its renewable resource contribution targets. The solar park is located in Seih Al-Dahal, the area of 48 km<sup>2</sup> is enough to construct plants (PV and CSP) with a total capacity of 1000 MW by 2030.

How much solar energy does the UAE need?

The UAE is expected to generate 25% of its electricity from solar energy and have a total installed solar capacity of 44 GW by 2050. The Middle East Solar Industry Association (MESIA) describes the challenges the country has to address to make this target achievable.

It uses 152,880 FS-385 black CdTe modules and generates about 24 gigawatt-hours per year.
