

What is the national energy policy of St Vincent and the Grenadines?

Established in 2009, the National Energy Policy (NEP) of St. Vincent and the Grenadines provides a plan for the energy sector in the country that addresses sustainability issues. This document was followed in 2010 by the National Energy Action Plan (NEAP), which consolidated policies into actionable steps.

What is the energy tariff in St Vincent & the Grenadines?

How much does electricity cost in St Vincent & the Grenadines?

This profile provides a snapshot of the energy landscape of St Vincent and the Grenadines--islands between the Caribbean Sea and North Atlantic Ocean, north of Trinidad and Tobago. St Vincent's utility residential rates start at \$0.26 per kilowatt-hour (kWh), which is below the Caribbean regional average of \$0.33/kWh.

Where is Saint Vincent & the Grenadines located?

To the north of Saint Vincent lies Saint Lucia, to the east is Barbados, and Grenada lies to the south. Saint Vincent and the Grenadines has a population density of over 300 inhabitants/km² (700 per sq mi), with an estimated population of 110,872. Kingstown is the capital and main port.

How many phone lines are there in Saint Vincent & the Grenadines?

The airport is on the island's east coast about 8.3 km (5.17 miles) from Kingstown. [citation needed] In 2010, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines had 21,700 telephone land lines. Its land telephone system is fully automatic, covering the entire island and all of the inhabited Grenadine islands. In 2002, there were 10,000 mobile phones.

How big is Saint Vincent & Grenadines?

Its 369 km² (142 sq mi) territory consists of the main island of Saint Vincent and, south of that, two-thirds of the northern part of the Grenadines, a chain of 32 smaller islands.
