

Vatican Solar Path. Building solar plants is a part of the Vatican's historical plan to go green. In 1971 Pope Paul VI in 1971 said that "humanity risked destroying nature by exploiting it". However, the first materialistic steps were made only in 2008, when 2,400 solar panels were installed on the roofs of the Vatican's Paul V Hall.

An agrivoltaic solar plant will be constructed at the Santa Maria di Galeria, a 424-hectare property on the edge of Rome that is owned by the Vatican and is now used for the transmission facilities for Vatican Radio. The solar power produced on the site will be used for Vatican Radio and will contribute to the energy needs of Vatican City.

"We must make a transition towards a model of sustainable development that reduces greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere, to achieve the objective of climate neutrality," the pope wrote in the letter, dated June 21. He said the plant would produce enough energy to power not only the Vatican Radio transmission centre already located on the site, but ...
